

SPECIAL EVENTS/TROPHIES

The following special trophies have been awarded at Oceania Regional Championships:

THE CLEM GREEN 1500m

At the Oceania Championships in Auckland in 1990, the OAVA Council resolved that the 1500m group of events at Oceania Championships would be known as The Clem Green 1500s in appreciation of Clem's efforts in founding the Oceania Veterans/Masters Athletics Association.

The trophy is awarded for the highest age-graded performance in 1500m events at each Championship. It is engraved with the name of each winner and now kept in the possession of the OMA Secretary who is required to bring it to OMA Championships to have on display. A certificate is issued to the winner.

The trophy ("Tu Manu To") symbolises the intersocial co-operation of veteran athletes of the various ethnic groups in the Oceania region.

THE INTER-ISLAND CHALLENGE SHIELD

This shield is awarded to the best island affiliate or associate (excluding New Zealand and Australia), scored on the basis of 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 points for overall placings over all events. With the winner decided on total points divided by the number of athletes, provided there are a minimum of 3 athletes representing the affiliate or associate. The objective is not simply to foster friendly inter-island competition, and but also to encourage greater participation from the islands.

THE AILSA FORBES MEMORIAL (DISCONTINUED)

This award was instituted at the 1992 Championships on Norfolk Island, following a decision taken by Council at a Brisbane meeting in October 1991. It was discontinued in 2004 due to the unknown whereabouts of the trophy.

It was established in recognition of the achievements of the Ailsa Forbes in Veteran athletics. Ailsa commenced veteran athletic activity in her 70's and was a keen and successful competitor in a range of track, walk, and field events until she was tragically killed when training in her mid-80s.

The award was for the best age-graded performance by women aged 55 and over in the 3000m Track Walk in the Oceania Championships. Where a 3000mWalk is not held, the award is made for the 5000mWalk.
